Talbott took over the program in 1999 and, is 300-169 in 21 seasons with one state championship and two Shoreline Conference titles. Sportsperson of the Week: Juliana Gagliardi

The culinary arts students were very busy throughout the fall semester. The basic food classes learned various cooking techniques such as sautéing, baking, roasting, pan frying, steaming and much more. They finished off the semester with another trip to CT Style showing off the winning gingerbread house from the annual gingerbread house competition.

The international cuisine class dove into recipes from many different countries, Italy, France, Poland, Greece to name a few. They finished off the semester with making food from different regions of the good ol' USA.

A new semester has started with new students in the culinary classes. All are very excited to learn all the tricks of the trade in the culinary world.





Child Development News:

Students in Early Childhood Internship and Laboratory Experience wrapped up the year with an in-school field trip to the HK Cubs Childcare Center. The field trip allowed the students to see how the Childcare Center operates throughout the school day. Students were able to assist in the routines of the day, see caregivers handle the achievements and challenges of each stage of early childhood (infant, toddler, and preschool) as well as the transitions between activities.



The children from the HK Cubs refer to the high school students as the "Big Kid Friends" and enjoy working with them in the Center as well as the child development classroom. High School students lead an activity with the toddlers or preschoolers on Thursdays and Fridays. This activity, known as "Big Kid Time," begins with a greeting, welcome song, read aloud, a fine motor activity (toddlers or preschoolers working the muscles in the hands and fingers) such as play dough, art, finger plays, and ends with a gross motor activity or exploration for toddlers (free play with toys that relate to the story and

fine motor activity of the day.) Plans and preparations for the activity precede the delivery each week and a reflection and evaluation follows to discuss "Big Kid Time" outcomes.

Interns and the Laboratory Experience class also spend time in the Center working along with the caregivers to see the children in their regular routines.

In addition, Introduction to Child Development concluded in semester one. This class investigates growth and development in childhood, heredity and environmental influences on the individual, family strengths and stresses, physical, social and emotional development, and intellectual development. Students researched a theory of development to share with the class. Weekly observations of children in the daycare center linked the class content to behavior.


News from the HK Players:

This year, HK Seniors Devin Coon and Arjun Badami will be directing One-Act plays as a culmination of their careers on the HK Stage. Arjun Badami will direct, *The One-Act Play Disaster*, by Don Zolidis. Badami has been a member of the HK Players for four years, acting in eleven plays on the HK stage throughout his time in high school, including as the Cowardly Lion in *The Wizard of Oz* and as Scrooge in *A Christmas Carol. REGISTRATION PROCESS:

If your son/daughter intends to play a Spring sport for HK, please register him/her through FamilyID *February 7- March 9*. A parent/guardian should register by clicking on this link:

Follow these steps:

To find your program, click on the link provided by the Organization above and select the registration form under the word *Programs*.

Next click on the green *Register Now* button and scroll, if necessary, to the *Create Account/Log In* green buttons. If this is your first time using FamilyID, click *Create Account*. Click *Log In*, if you already have a FamilyID account.

Create your secure FamilyID account by entering the account owner First and Last names (parent/guardian), E-mail address and password. Select *I Agree* to the FamilyID Terms of Service. Click *Create Account*.

You will receive an email with a link to activate your new account. (If you don't see the email, check your E-mail filters (spam, junk, etc.).

Click on the link in your activation E-mail, which will log you in to FamilyID.com

Once in the registration form, complete the information requested. All fields with a red* are required to have an answer.

Click the *Continue* button when your form is complete.

Review your registration summary.

Click the green *Submit* button. After selecting 'Submit', the registration will be complete. You will receive a completion email from FamilyID confirming your registration.

Teacher Websites:

In the past, teachers have used their Weebly websites for students to access information about class, view teacher calendars, and to see class notes and assignments. Although some teachers are still utilizing their Weebly website, many have transitioned to keeping all of this information on Google Classroom. Google Classroom is designed for education and works seamlessly with other Google products that teachers and students use such as Google Docs, Google Sheets, and Google Forms. When students join their teacher's Google Classroom they are able to see teacher announcements, complete assignments, and collaborate with the teacher and their peers in numerous ways. Furthermore, when teachers assign homework on their Google Classroom, that assignment is automatically added to a student's Google Calendar.

Parent access to Google Classroom is set up differently than a Weebly website. Rather than visit a teacher's website directly, parents need to join teacher's Google Classrooms. If you would like to join and view your student's Google Classroom pages, please email your student's teachers asking for the teachers to add you to the parent interface of Google Classroom. Through this, you can select to receive either daily or weekly updates in regards to your student's progress in that class. As always, PowerSchool will still be used to view grades.

We ask for your patience as we navigate this transition to Google products. Our intentions are always to provide excellent communication with parents and families. Teachers are available at their @rsd17.org email address. If you have any questions about teacher websites please do not hesitate to reach out to your student's teachers, school counselor, or a school administrator.

Student Email Addresses:

Every student has been provided with a Regional School District 17 email address. The format for their email address is their student ID number followed by the @rsd17.org. For example, a student's email address may be <u>123456@rsd17.org</u>. The expectation is that students should begin checking their school email weekly, and that communication from students comes from school email addresses. If your child needs to reset their password, they can see Ms. Kohs in the Media Center.

Counselors are scheduling Junior Planning Meetings with our Junior students and their families.
